

## Award for Excellence in Scholarship in the Humanities and Social Sciences

The purpose of this program is to reward scholarship and improve retention among graduate students in the humanities and social sciences, and to provide financial support to assist them in the timely completion of doctoral studies. This program complements the VPRGS *Fellowship Enhancement for Outstanding Doctoral Candidates*, which targets the recruitment of outstanding new students to U.Va. doctoral programs. The University's desire is to achieve excellence in all aspects of graduate education. One-time fellowship awards of \$5,000 will be made to reward current Ph.D. students in the humanities and social sciences who have demonstrated rigorous scholarship in their discipline. Departments with fewer than 50 Ph.D. students may nominate one student; departments with more than 50 Ph.D. students may nominate two students. † VPRGS anticipates making 6-8 awards to a diverse group of students. The Commonwealth of Virginia, the source of funding for this program, requires that at least one-half of the awards be made to residents of the Commonwealth.

**Criteria:** Nominees should be Ph.D. students that are sufficiently advanced in their program to have demonstrated excellence in original scholarship. The purpose is to reward students that are bringing recognition to graduate programs at the University of Virginia as a result of their intellect, dedication, creativity, and passion. Students must also have strong academic credentials, as evidenced by performance in coursework and on comprehensive examinations. Students who have competed successfully for external fellowships are eligible. In fact, we encourage nomination of students who have been awarded national fellowships, especially in cases where the fellowship stipend does not meet a department's typical stipend level.

**Application Materials:** Applications must include a nomination cover letter from a departmental representative, curriculum vitae, and current transcript of the student. The nomination letter should describe the scholarship of the student and make the case for the award. Examples of scholarship may include published essays, stories, critical reviews, national awards, coursework, presentations at national meetings, etc. Please note in the nomination letter whether or not the student is a Virginia resident.

**Submission Deadlines:** Application materials for nominees are due to the Office of the Vice President for Research & Graduate Studies by December 21, 2007. We anticipate announcing award winners by January 25, 2008. Electronic submission of application materials to [gradstudies@virginia.edu](mailto:gradstudies@virginia.edu) is encouraged.
